

The Boathouse

on Oyster Creek in Sugar Land is a classic 2 bay wood frame structure situated among neighborhoods both new and old. Set along a linear park that fronts the creek (Lake Pointe Creek Bend Park), it's been plugged into a growing community fit for enjoying the waterways. It was purpose designed for the **Greater Houston Rowing Club**, as well as water recreation programs sponsored by First Colony Community Association.

The **Greater Houston Rowing Club**, has called Oyster Creek home for over 20 years. The new Boathouse means we're moving upstream.

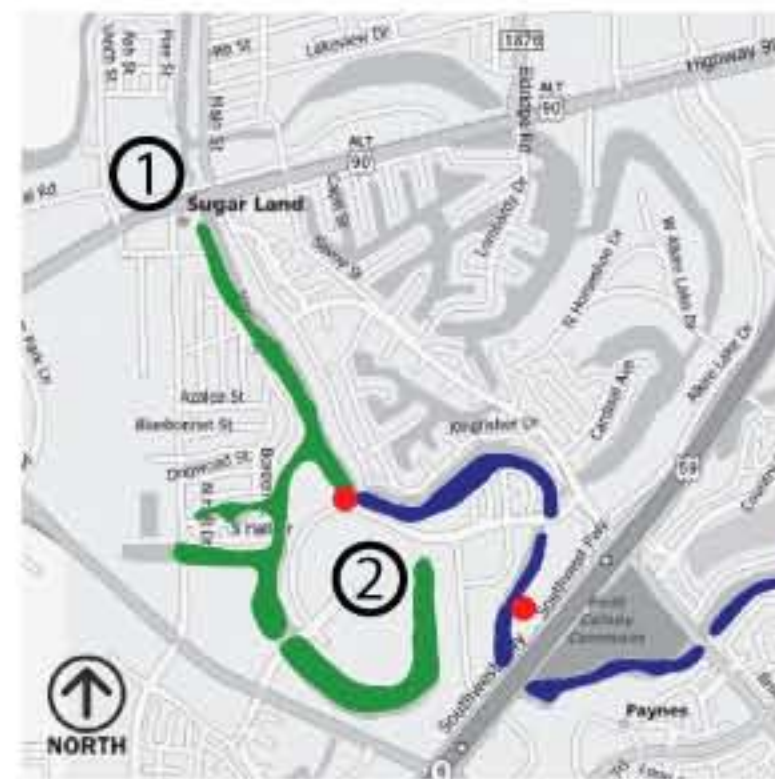
Boathouse is 48' wide x 100' deep. Two bays.

12' clear ceilings above concrete floor, for stacking boats 5 to 6 high, almost doubling current capacity.

Two 60' docks on both upper and lower reaches of the dam – plenty long for loading and unloading eight-person shells.

3.8 km additional water access at upper reach of the dam, including a 1.4 km straight-away – ideal for Sprint race training.

Continued access to a 5.75 km stretch at lower reach – ideal for head race training.

- 1.4 km Upper Reach (Boathouse to bridge near Sugar Plant)
- 2.4 km Upper Reach (Boathouse to Brooks Lake)
- 5.75 km Lower Reach (Boathouse to dam near Lexington Blvd.)
